Madison: what has changed recently? New principal assigned to the school in 2022. Madison is a designated PUSD STEM focus school, with a science teacher who works with all grade levels. In 2020-2021, the school’s attendance zone expanded to include the former Roosevelt attendance zone. Madison is one of six PUSD schools included in a Community Schools initiative with funding to create school-based hubs of service and engagement that respond holistically to the academic, social and health needs of children, youth and families.

School Environment / Social-Emotional Learning

Mission: *Create a school community that works together to provide an exceptional educational experience that promotes discovery, innovation, and leadership skills in order to be college and career ready. Our vision is to empower students to be lifelong learners that demonstrate knowledge, skills, and values required to be productive members of a global society.*

4th and 5th graders are invited to participate in a Leadership Program with Marshall High School and Pasadena City College students as mentors. Students do service learning projects.

As part of the district’s Community Schools consortium, Madison will be implementing tiered academic supports, parent engagement and social-emotional support services designed to respond to the holistic needs of children, youth and families.
