
Eligibility Dates



- Kindergarten
 - 5 years old by September 1, 2019
- Transitional Kindergarten
 - 5 years old between September 2-December 2, 2019
- First Grade
 - 6 years old on or before September 1, 2019


What is Open Enrollment?

- School Choice Random lottery
 - School other than your neighborhood school of residence
 - Dual Language Immersion Program
 - Marshall Fundamental Secondary School
 - Neighborhood School



What About Magnet Schools like Arts and STEM or STEAM?

• Only if they are not your assigned school of residence



How Does the Open Enrollment Lottery Process Work?

- Submit one application per student
- In preference order, list the schools you prefer to your neighborhood school
- Random Lottery system assigns each application a number
- Families will be notified by mail of their placement
- Families either...
 - Register at their assigned school OR
 - Notify PUSD they want to enter the 2nd lottery to try for a higher placement without losing their placement from the first lottery OR
 - Leave the Open Enrollment process by doing nothing

What's the Second Lottery?

- After the first lottery is completed, principals re-evaluate the number of seats that are still available for the second lottery
- Families who participated in the first lottery and select to stay in the second lottery, keep their same preference list
- Families who missed the first lottery may enter the second lottery and select all schools they prefer to their assigned school of residence
- Families are notified of their placement from the second lottery
- Families register at their assigned school and can be placed on wait lists for all schools on their list that they prefer to their placement

Open Enrollment Wait Lists

- Families are notified as spaces become available at a preferred school
- Families remain on the wait lists until August 9, 2019

What is a Neighborhood Preference?

- 50% of projected available seats
- Must select your neighborhood preference school as your first choice
- Lottery recognizes address

 If more applicants in neighborhood preference zone than seats available, then second chance in the lottery

How Many Seats Will Be Available?

- First Lottery:
 - Enrollment Trends
 - Demographic Data
 - Siblings & Priority Registrations
- Second Lottery:
 - Families who didn't register from first lottery
 - Possible adjustments

Projections will be on the PUSD website prior to the start of Open Enrollment

What Do I Need to Register?



- Your child's birth certificate
- Your child's most recent immunization and vaccination record
- Recent gas, electric or water bill in your name
- Either a deed of trust, mortgage payment receipt, rental/lease agreement, property tax bill or closing escrow papers
- Transcript for secondary students

Priority & Sibling Registration

- Siblings of current students are guaranteed enrollment and do not participate in Open Enrollment
- Dual Language Immersion Program students register directly at the continuing DLIP school
- Willard's International Baccalaureate Program students register directly at Blair IB
